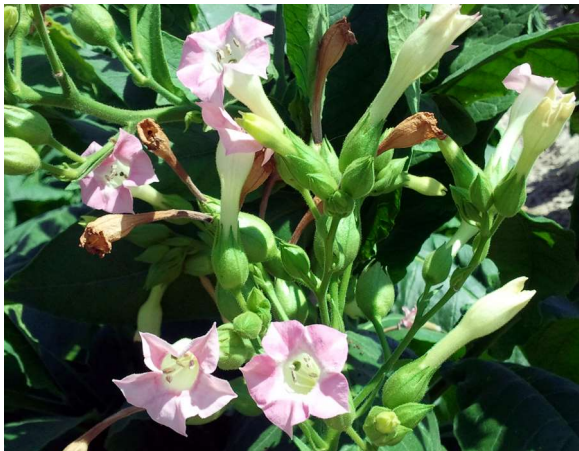


San Andrés

Cigar

San Andrés is a cigar variety collected in Mexico, in 1929. "A special variety said to be from the best tobacco grown in the vicinity of San Andres Tuxtla." Classed by USDA as a cigar filler, the leaf makes excellent wrappers and binders.

[The distinctive, lightly smoky aroma of commercial San Andrés leaf is created by heating the curing barns with low fires of dried banana plant debris.]



Days to Maturity: 45-70
Spacing: 24-36 inches
Plant Height: 50-60 inches
Leaf Length: 17-22 inches
Leaf Width: 9-12 inches
Leaf Count: 17-21
