Burley



NB-11 is a productive burley type that was developed by grower selection from unknown seed in New Brunswick, Canada, in 2005, and was stabilized in 2011.

[Original grower: Growing out, I got 19 distinctly different plants. Most were junk. But this one was exceptional...large leaves, mild, very sturdy stalks.]

Can be primed or stalk-cut and stalk-hung for curing. (Leaf maturation may require 40 or more days beyond blossom.) It air-cures easily to a rich, medium brown. Suitable for cigarette or pipe blending. This has been a grower favorite burley on the Fair Trade Tobacco forum.



Days to Maturity: 52 (leaf maturity at ~95 days)
Spacing: 24-36 inches
Plant Height: 42 inches
Leaf Length: 22 inches
Leaf Width: 13 inches
Leaf Count: 16-18
